I can smile now, even though I cringe, but I still remember childhood conversations with my brother and sisters about how unfair it seemed that there was a Mothering Sunday but no 'Children's Day'. Looking back, it's clear we had a bit to learn about thankfulness and about recognising all that we should have been appreciating.

Mothering Sunday is a time to celebrate mothers and recognise their love, care, and all they do for us. Of course, appreciation shouldn't be reserved for one day a year, but it's good to set aside a special moment to focus on mothers and the extraordinary love, protection, nurturing, and sacrifice they show. Patience certainly deserves a place on that list too! I remember my own mother demonstrating nothing more than a mother's gift for rolling her eyes when dealing with her ungrateful brood and their whinging about the lack of a 'Children's Day'.

Mothering Sunday also reminds us of the greater and perfect love that inspires all human love: God's love revealed in Jesus Christ.
