Advent - A Season of Preparation

As Christmas celebrations seem to start earlier each year Advent can so easily get lost. Sadly, we then miss out if we jump straight to Christmas without the Advent work of preparing, watching and waiting. Observing Advent helps us to slow down and pay attention to the hope we have. It reminds us of what we are celebrating: that the birth of Jesus was the

beginning of God's great rescue plan, with the sure and certain hope we have of its fulfilment when Jesus comes again as King of Kings.

During Advent, we can simply count down the days to Christmas, or we can use the time as a focus to make some extra room for Christ. That could mean setting aside some extra time each day to



pray, engaging with Advent resources, renewing our focus on Christ as we light Advent candles or open Advent calendars. 

Christmas Present Appeal

Donations can be made in different ways.

- 1) Money. Donations of money are very welcome especially as Gift Aid* can be claimed to increase the value of financial donations. (Please see below for information about Gift Aid.)
- 2) Goods. It's not intended that every bag will be identical so anything appropriate for a Christmas bag would work well. Biscuits, chocolates, a tin of Christmas ham etc. would all be appreciated.

Donations are will always be welcome. However, to allow shopping and organising it would be really helpful if donations could be made by Sunday the 14th of December at the latest. - Sooner, would be even better.

*Gift Aid

Gift Aid is a UK government scheme that allows charities to claim an extra 25p for every £1 donated, at no additional cost to the donor. There are two ways Gift Aid can be claimed:

- 1. For individual donations of £30 or less, given in cash or via contactless card machines, the church can claim a 25% top-up through the Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme (GASDS). Donors do not even need to provide their name, let alone complete any paperwork for these donations and don't need to be paying tax.
- 2. For donations over £30, the church can claim Gift Aid from donors who are UK taxpayers and have paid enough income or capital gains tax to cover the amount claimed. To enable this, donors must complete a Gift Aid declaration form. By doing so, they confirm their taxpayer status and allow the church to claim Gift Aid on their donations.
