Christ THE King

Today is the Sunday the church calendar calls Christ the King. Before we enter Advent and prepare for Christmas, Christ the King Sunday invites us to

pause and remember that the baby whose birth we are joyfully preparing to celebrate is now the risen and ascended Christ the King.

His kingship is unlike any earthly rule. Other kings and kingdoms come and go, but Christ died to establish a kingdom that will last forever. Where worldly rulers seek control, Christ brings freedom; where others lead through fear, He leads with love.

A kingdom is where a king rules. Christ rules

in Heaven and over the Earth, but not yet all the Earth. His authority on Earth is contested and, sadly, often rejected for now. That is why we are led to pray "your Kingdom come, your will be done, on Earth as in Heaven." Each of us has the choice to live in Christ's Kingdom, under the rule (and loving care) of King Jesus, or to live outside His Kingdom, ruled by the pressures, values and forces of this world.

Christ died not only to establish his Kingdom, but to invite us to live in it, under His care, protected through doing His will and at one with the eternal King. The question for each of us is: will we choose to do His will "on Earth as it is in Heaven", and so bear witness that Christ is THE King?



Christmas Present Appeal

We are very grateful that these plans have been generously underwritten to allow the books to be bought. Donations will of course still be needed and much appreciated.

Donations can be made in different ways.

- 1) Money. Donations of money are very welcome especially as Gift Aid* can be claimed to increase the value of financial donations. (Please see below for information about Gift Aid.)
- 2) Goods. It's not intended that every bag will be identical so anything appropriate for a Christmas bag would work well. Biscuits, chocolates, a tin of Christmas ham etc would all be appreciated.

*Gift Aid

Gift Aid is a UK government scheme that allows charities to claim an extra 25p for every £1 donated at no additional cost to the donor. There are two ways Gift Aid can be claimed:

- 1. For individual donations of £30 or less, given in cash or via contactless card machines, the church can claim a 25% top-up through the Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme (GASDS). Donors do not even need to provide their name, let alone complete any paperwork for these donations and don't need to be paying tax.
- 2. For donations over £30, the church can claim Gift Aid from donors who are UK taxpayers and have paid enough income or capital gains tax to cover the amount claimed. To enable this, donors must complete a Gift Aid declaration form. By doing so, they confirm their taxpayer status and allow the church to claim Gift Aid on their donations.
