SAFEGUARDING SUNDAY

Readings: 2 Thessalonians 3.6-13 & Luke 21.5-19

Faith beyond what crumbles

Luke 21:5-19 is unsettling to hear, especially in a world where change is relentless and uncertainty seems to deepen every day.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus stands with His disciples beside the magnificent Jerusalem Temple—a symbol of stability and certainty. Yet He warns them: "The time will come when not one stone will be left on



another; every one of them will be thrown down." For Jesus' listeners, this was unthinkable, and even for us, it can be alarming. Reflecting on Jesus' words today reminds us of the many changes around us, which are often uncomfortable at best and sometimes even frightening.

Rather than offering easy reassurance, Jesus invites His followers to see beyond what is temporary. He doesn't promise to spare us from hardship. Instead, He is brutally honest: there will be shaking, opposition, and even betrayal. The world's great institutions and confident certainties will crumble. Yet into this reality, Jesus speaks hope and says, "Stand firm, and you will win life." Endurance becomes the mark of Christian life—an endurance not simply about gritting our teeth, but about a courage and peace born from trust in God's unfailing presence and the knowledge that all God intends and plans will be perfectly fulfilled. 
